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The discipline of Business Continuity Management (BCM) can greatly help organizations continue business or deal with major disruptions arising from disasters and crises.

BCM is one of the most important management disciplines for mitigating the impact of a disaster, whether it be due to fire, pandemic, supply chain disruption, flood, severe weather, IT failure, cyber-attacks, political strife, labour unrest or other.

BCM either directly helps to mitigate these disasters, or indirectly provides a framework or command point for a multi-disciplinary collaborative approach in addressing threats.

In this program, we will additionally cover a crucial BCM technique called Business Impact Analysis or BIA that will analyze the "essence" of the organization that must be protected, as it can be too expensive and difficult to protect every single part of the organization. It then covers strategies and solutions for protecting this "essence" thereby providing life-support to the organization when it is threatened to the core by a disaster.
